



Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Waiver

Beginning July 1, 2019 the following services housed under the Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Medicaid Section 1115 Waiver will transition to managed care:

- All residential services
- Peer-to-peer recovery
- Naloxone administration by ambulance transport

Methadone is not transitioning to managed care and will remain under the fee-for-service program.

In order to participate in the WV Medicaid Program, and receive payment from The Health Plan, providers of SUD Waiver Services must meet all enrollment criteria which is described in Chapters 300 and 504 of BMS's Provider Manual.
